UNIT OVERVIEW:

The aim of this unit is to introduce students to sculpture through the exploration of basic 3dimensional techniques and approaches. Within this unit students will be asked to visualise ideas on 3dimensions by exploring, selecting and utilizing appropriate sculptural methods in relation to their studio practice or/and their wider art context. This unit will be assessed through the development and presentation of experimental 3d work and final presentation.

INDICATIVE CONTENT:

This unit encourages students to explore sculpture through experimental work and build a portfolio using basic sculpture techniques and processes. Students will be able to develop basic skills in processes of sculpting and produce a series of experimental work that shows personal ideas and interests.

Within this unit students will be ask to demonstrate understanding of various 3d techniques through experimentation and evaluation. Students will learn how to manipulate media and how to visualise ideas in a 3d form through the given tasks and assignments.

Students will learn through ongoing workshops and independent work in parellel with tutorials and group discussions and they will be asked to produce a coherent and new body of work presented in a professional manner.

- 4. Develop 3d responses in relation to contemporary and historical contexts and creative practice.
- 5. Demonstrate critical and evaluative tools that persue the connection of art theories and sculpture in relation to own creative practice.
